

# Christmas Table Topper

44" square

Fabric supplies for top and binding:

- 2 - Crazy Eights Turnover
- 1 cream colored fat quarter
- 1 yard of red border fabric

Sort your Turnover pieces by color. For this project you will need:

- 4 – aqua triangles
- 12 – blue triangles
- 20 – red triangles
- 28 – green triangles
- 64 – cream triangles (you will need to cut some from your fat quarter)

Match up a cream colored triangle with a “colored” triangles, placing right sides together. Trim the long side of the triangle to be sure they are straight. Sew these two pieces together. Press to the dark fabrics. Using the Triangle Square Up Ruler from Quilt in a Day, trim your squares to 5”.

Arrange your squares in the same manner as the picture below:



## Christmas Table Topper (cont.)

After you have your squares stitched together, it is time to add your borders. Measure the center of the piece, using this measurement cut your side borders. Add borders and press.

Now measure from the center, including the borders and use this measurement to add your top and bottom border. Your table topper should be very nice and square.

Layer and pin your table topper. Quilt as desired. We used a combination of straight line quilting (in the cream areas) and embroidery in the rest. The embroidery designs we used for the border were HG284\_48 and HG286\_48 from OESD's Christmas Redwork 3 (#12259)

Bind your table topper and enjoy!

### Additional Supplies for Class:

Sewing machine

Presser feet: ¼" patchwork (#37 or #57), walking foot

Triangle Square Up Ruler from Quilt in a Day

Basic quilting supplies (rulers, mat and cutter)

Mettler thread: light tan or beige

Straight pins

Seam ripper

Scissors
