Description: Last year I saw one of these shawls in a catalog and wanted to make it, but ran out of time. This year I got started early. This very, easy shawl that is made from a large rectangle of Polarfleece. It is edged on the serger and hemmed on the sewing machine. It has pockets (for your Kleenex) and two front snaps to help keep it closed. This is a fabulous gift to give someone to throw over their shoulders on a chilly evening.

Techniques Explored: Edging with the serger, mitering corners on a hem, working with Polarfleece

Supply List

Sewing machine

Presser Feet: walking foot, #37 (1/4" patchwork foot)

Serger

Fabrics: 1 yd of Polarfleece fabric—Cut into the following sizes: 59" x 25" and 2 pcs. 8 3/4" x 8 1/4"

Mettler thread: to match Polarfleece (I used two spools and one bobbin to complete my project.)

Scrap Master ruler

Seam gauge

Straight pins

Basic sewing notions
